**FANTASTIC NEWS: Year 6 KS2 Teacher Assessment and SAT results 2024**

Dear Parents/Carers,

**Fantastic news: School achieves brilliant SATs results for 2024**

I am absolutely delighted to be able to tell you that our SATs results this year are truly exceptional and continue to show great upward trend!

Nationally, 61% of pupils met what is called 'the government's expected standard' in the key subjects reading, writing and maths, known as the 'Combined' score.

Our children did very much better than this.

**Enfield Heights achieved a Combined score of 80% - Very significantly above the national average.**

We expect our results to be some of the best in the borough.

These results are even better than last year and show strong provision with accelerated progress we are making. Together as a school - teachers, governors, children and families - we have all worked tirelessly applying a robust gap analysis at every stage of our assessment process and providing high quality provision throughout the year to ensure every single pupil has made accelerated progress. This helped us achieve this level of success. You can be immensely proud of your children. Thank you to the teaching team for their incredible dedication and expertise!


