Black History Month- Steel Pan workshop





As a school we are continuously looking to educate our children about people, events, dates, monumental moments in time as we believe this is key to helping them feel informed about historical occasions that have had such great impacts on our world and shaped how we are as humans. This October we celebrate Back History and this year's theme is **Reclaiming Narratives**. It marks a powerful shift in how we view and celebrate Black history and culture. It's about challenging the narratives that have historically marginalised Black achievements and instead highlighting stories of resilience, success, and empowerment.

Mr Merritt-Hall, our Music Lead, organised a fantastic steelpan workshop for the children on Tuesday 15th October. The steelpan (also known as a pan, steel drum) is a musical instrument originating in Trinidad and Tobago. Often described as the sunniest music on the planet, I am sure that this steel pans workshop will give our pupils a fun and uplifting experience!

Miss Cooper, our PSHE and RE lead, has organised fantastic workshops for Anti Bullying week on Monday 11th November. All year groups will be participating in interactive workshops to understand bullying.

'I Wish I Coud' (Confidence and Self Esteem) for Reception children

In the rainbow forest the insects are having a talent competition. The winner gets to add a new story to the story tree! Tara is the only person who isn't excited; she's the judge. How will she choose a winner? A tale about talents old and new, and learning to be the most proud of you.

<u>What Would You Do?</u> for Years 1 to 6 – a fantastic experience which will enable whole year groups to work together to explore key anti bullying themes, in the most enjoyable and creative way! The Winter fair is a great fundraiser for the school's and this year we are raising money for listening equipment and audio stories for the children.


This year we are asking families to donate the following:
